This first issue of the WPRU Bulletin is dedicated to John Norton. It is a small effort on our part to express the gratitude we have for the man who, in the past month, has spent most of his days and nights working to improve WPRU. Forsaking sleep and relaxation he has devoted all his time to his "Black Box" and the personnel supervision of the station during Bicker.

John is a Senior and stands near the top of his class scholasticly. He has been a member of WPRU for four years and is the only "A" engineer on the station.

The time: 2:07 AM February 21, 1955. place: the control room of WPRU, with oscilloscopes, meters, soldering irons, and various implements known only to the Technical Department scattered about. The action: clipping a 27.000 ohm resistor from a terminal inside the Black Box to which also run several other wires. The result: Cesar Frank's Symphony in D Minor comes blaring through the control room monitor.

Thus was completed a venture which began last November as a theory dreamed up by a WPRU engineer for something to talk about on the way home to a Thanksgiving dinner. Little did he dream then to what use would his device have to be put in a few months. In the original conception, there was to be but one box: located in Holder, it would provide reception for those rooms which were then unable to receive WPRU from the main transmitter. If the device was successful, its use would be extended to other places around campus, at a cost of several dollars a month, to provide reception in those few areas where WPRU's signal was weak.

All this, however, did not consider the effect of a certain government regulatory body which is known as the Federal Communications Commission. This group had paid WPRU visits in the past but had never really been obnoxious about the fabulous amount of emissiony which WPRU's transmission facilities indulged in. The afternoon of January 25, 1955, however, was different. Two little men from the above-mentioned federal organization visited the charming town of Princeton and made a few measurements. After talking with David Meginnity, they went back to their home office in New York. Matters rested until Saturday morning, February 12, when WPRU was informed the transmitter may never again operate at full power. On Monday morning it was turned down and on Tuesday it was decided to set the transmitter to operate in such a way as to cover only Pyne and possibly the dormi-

JOHN NORTON'S "BLACK BOX" (cont. from page one)

This, of course, could not continue to be the state of operation of WPRU. The only solution which seemed to be available was the Thanksgiving Day dream of John Norton, the engineer. During Christmas vacation he had obtained some parts to build a pilot model, and it was constucted before the beginning of classes in January. As with most wonderfuls ideas, however, the device didn't work. Further labor on "the black box", as it was now affectionately known, resulted in satisfactory operation. Due to the unfortunate loyality of a certain former staff member to the telephone company, however, the mode of operation of the box as then constructed was prohibited, necessitating a completely new design.

This was where matters stood on February 12, when an immediate solution became mandatory. A paste and pray modification of the original box was made, which seemed to indicate that the new scheme should be able to work satisfactorily.

The next step, obviously, was to obtain commercial components for several units, build them, and distribute them around the campus. The required transportation to Philadelphia was fur-

nished Friday, February 18, by Paul Dunn, who was accompanied by the former staff member, Dave Meginnity, Ned Irons, and the brains behind the whole plan, John Norton.

One unit was begun Friday evening and completed Saturday afternoon. The tedious job of adjusting the circuit for satisfact-ory operation and modifying it when necessary was done Saturday evening (until 4:00AM) and Sunday night. At 2:07 Monday morning, the final change was made that resulted in satisfactory operation of The Black Box. By employing the boxes it is to be hoped that WPRU will be received clearly and easily by every radio on campus.
